- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at greater wear values, while others look greatly damaged. Understanding how float worths effect rate is essential if you intend to trade or offer your unboxed items.

3. Think About Buying Directly

If there is a particular skin you frantically desire, the most economical path is often purchasing it directly off the Steam Market or a trusted third-party marketplace, instead of attempting to bet for it through case openings.
