1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most well-known skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped solely on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout significant tournaments, these souvenir plans are now exceptionally rare. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star player Skaddoodle notoriously sold for over £ 60,000 [case opening](#) years earlier, and prices have just escalated since.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is relatively budget friendly, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover nearly the entire top receiver of the gun in a pristine, reflective blue. Because the odds of unpacking this exact pattern with a good float worth are astronomically low, these products have commanded private deals going beyond six figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Howl

The Howl is unique because it holds historical significance. Valve got rid of the original artwork due to a copyright infringement claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve upgraded the style and stopped it from dropping totally. Anybody holding a Howl at that time kept it, creating a permanently topped supply.
