Understanding Wear Conditions (Float Values)

The physical condition of a skin is among the most important elements in its prices. Surprisingly, some skins actually look better or preferred with wear (such as particular "Battle-Scarred" Laminates or Asiimovs), though many command greater rates the closer they are to pristine condition.

Wear Condition Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine, perfect finish with little to no scratches or acnes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Small wear, generally minor scratching near the edges and high-friction areas. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible wear and tear, noticeable scratches, and slight fading of colors. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable dullness in

color brightness. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Severe wear, heavily faded graphics, extreme scratches, and rusted elements.
