Players often attempt to find patterns or “strategies” for features like expanding wilds, hoping to predict their appearance. The reality is that each spin is an **independent event**. Previous outcomes have no bearing on future spins.

This misunderstanding, known as *gambler’s fallacy*, can lead to poor decision-making such as increasing bets irrationally or chasing losses expecting a payoff. Remember:

- Expanding wilds appearing multiple times in a session is a random coincidence, not a pattern.
- The **Return to Player (RTP)** percentage reflects long-term expected returns over thousands of spins—not short-term guarantees.
- There is no “strategy” that can influence how the reels or expanding wilds behave.
