- **Prize:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a common pot. A winner is drawn arbitrarily, with higher-value deposits increasing a gamer's analytical chance of winning the whole pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both include wagering, CS2 gambling differs considerably from standard online gambling in terms of currency, accessibility, and community combination.
