Anybody holding a Howl kept it, creating a completely topped supply.

2. The "Blue Gem" Phenomenon

- **Well-Worn:** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred:** 0.45-- 1.00. Particular skins are "float capped," meaning they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float Minimal Wear variants remarkably valuable.
