A 20-year-old system might consume 40 to 50 percent more energy than a new SEER2-rated unit to deliver the same comfort. What Does Efficiency Actually Mean When You Compare Repair Versus Replacement?

Efficiency in HVAC terms refers to how much cooling or heating output you get per dollar spent on electricity. The industry measures this with SEER2 ratings for air conditioning (higher numbers mean more efficient) and AFUE for heating. An older unit with a SEER2 rating of 10 or lower is considered poor by modern standards; today's minimum federal requirement is SEER2 13, and quality replacements often reach 16 to 18. When Does the Long-Term Operating Cost Favor Replacing Your Current Unit?

The decision hinges on comparing repair cost plus expected remaining operating costs against replacement cost plus the lower operating costs of a new system. If your current HVAC is 12 to 15 years old and requires a major repair—such as compressor replacement, which can cost \$1,500 to \$2,500—you should calculate how many years remain before the unit reaches its typical 15 to 20 year lifespan. If only 3 to 5 years remain, a replacement unit will save more in energy costs than the repair will cost you upfront.
