Throughout the years, Valve has issued numerous cease-and-desist letters to popular gambling operators, updating its csgamblingsite.com Steam Subscriber Agreement to prohibit industrial usage of accounts and shutting down numerous automated trade bots.

Regardless of these efforts, operators frequently adjust by migrating to brand-new domains, utilizing decentralized payment methods, or decoupling their platforms from direct Steam API logins, making complete removal hard.
