- **Research Case Contents:** Before entering a battle with custom case mixes, inspect the chances and potential high-tier drops.
- **Avoid Over-priced Custom Cases:** Many sites allow users to develop custom lobbies with absurdly costly cases. Stay with basic, well-documented cases where the chances are mathematically understood.

4. Make Use Of the 2-Player Lobby Advantage

Statistically, entering a 1v1 battle uses a much better opportunity of winning (50% baseline) compared to a 4-player Free-For-All (25% baseline).
