

Can a Damaged Garage Door Panel Be Replaced?

In a lot of instances, a damaged garage door panel can be replaced without installing an brand-new door. A professional can take out the affected garage door panel, examine the surrounding hardware, and install a matching replacement panel. This is often the most sensible solution when the damage is confined to one section and the rest of the door remains in proper condition.

Most modern **sectional garage doors** consist of several horizontal panels connected by hinges and rollers. Because each section moves along the garage door tracks, a damaged section can sometimes be detached on its own. An **overhead garage-door system** may also be repaired this way if the replacement part fits the manufacturer model, panel profile, color, thickness, and hardware configuration.

Panel replacement is usually suitable for dents, localized vehicle impact, cracked sections, and moderate weather damage. However, a professional should examine the entire door before ordering a replacement panel. A bent track, damaged hinges, worn rollers, broken spring, or distorted frame may cause the new section to function improperly.

Vehicle impact is a frequent reason of a damaged garage door panel. A car may hit the lower section while driving in or out of the garage, damaging the panel, hinges, tracks, or vertical supports. Even a slow-moving impact can prevent the door from closing evenly.
