### Comprehending Wear Ratings and Rarities

Not all products are produced equal. Two gamers may own the precise very same cosmetic, however their appearances can vary hugely due to the video game's wear system.

#### The Five Wear Categories

When a weapon surface is dropped or unboxed, it is appointed a particular **Float Value** varying from 0.00 to 1.00. This float identifies how scratched, worn, or faded the texture appears in-game.

Wear Category | Drift Value Range | In-Game Appearance  
**Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, very little to no scratches or blemishes.  
**Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Very small wear, generally visible on close evaluation.  
**Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches and wear on prominent edges.  
**Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, paint fading, and prominent scratches.  
**Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or severely faded textures.

*(Note: Certain items really look better or become better in greater wear conditions-- such as the "AWP|Asiimov"-- while others require a beautiful Factory New condition to command high rates.)*



## Rarity Tiers

Weapon surfaces are further classified by color-coded rarity tiers, which determine how frequently they appear in cases and trade-ups:

- **Consumer Grade/ Industrial Grade (White/Light Blue):** Common, low-tier products typically used for standard trade-ups.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop-tier items.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon, desirable mid-tier surfaces.
- **Classified (Pink):** Rare and striking designs often central to collections.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest standard weapon tier, including iconic designs like the Redline or Fire Serpent.
- **Special/ Extraordinarily Rare (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. These are the crown gems of the marketplace.

## The Economy: Trading, Markets, and Value

The digital economy [CSGO Gambling](#) surrounding these items is totally player-driven. Valve sets the baseline through official in-game case drops and the Steam Community Market, however a huge external community exists through third-party trading sites, peer-to-peer markets, and neighborhood forums.

### Aspects That Influence Price

1. **Supply and Demand:** Items from older, ceased cases are rarer, driving up their market price.
2. **Drift and Pattern Templates:** Some products feature particular pattern indexes that alter the visual look totally (e.g., the "Case Hardened" pattern, where blue quantities dictate extreme worth).
3. **Sticker labels and StatTrak:** Applying rare, discontinued competition sticker labels can increase an item's value. StatTrak technology, which tracks the number of eliminates a gamer gets with a specific weapon, likewise commands a rate premium.
4. **Pro-Player Association:** When a professional esports gamer uses a specific weapon finish during a major tournament, need for that product often increases overnight.

When Valve released the sequel, one of the community's biggest concerns was the fate of their digital collections. Thankfully, Valve brought forward every single weapon finish, sticker label, and knife into the new engine.

In addition, the transition to the Source 2 engine brought enormous visual enhancements:

- **Lighting and Reflections:** Metallic finishes now catch light dynamically, making gold and chrome products look terribly sensible.
- **Geometry Changes:** Many designs were subtly renovated, permitting finishes to cover around the weapons with higher fidelity and better texturing than ever in the past.

- **Inspect Animations:** Inspecting items ended up being an enchanting experience due to enhanced physics and lighting interactions.

## Tips for Beginners Entering the Market

For those aiming to build their very first loadout or dip their toes into gathering, a few best practices can save cash and prevent mistakes:
