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What is the 135 Rule in Plumbing?



DO use a 1/4 inch per foot slope (approx. 2% or 1 in 50) for most drain pipes to ensure proper flow.



AVOID pipes that are too flat, as this causes slow drainage and potential clogs.



DO ensure adequate venting; the 1:35 rule often relates to slope-to-vent distance for proper function.



AVOID excessively steep drops, which can separate liquids from solids, leading to obstructions.



DO check local plumbing codes, as some specific areas or fixtures might utilize a 1:35 ratio (1 unit vertical to 35 horizontal) for certain situations.



AVOID ignoring slope requirements during emergency repairs; correct pitch prevents future backups.



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
