4. Prize

In a Jackpot video game, several gamers toss skins into a central pot. Each skin contributes to the player's total percentage chance of winning the entire pot (based upon the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky player takes home all the deposited skins.
