- **Be Careful of API Scams:** Never log into a website that looks similar to Steam unless the URL is clearly steamcommunity.com or steampowered.com. Scammers often use fake login pages to take API secrets and pirate trades.
- **Verify Trade URLs:** Ensure that the trade URL utilized on third-party websites comes from the appropriate account and hasn't been obstructed by malware.

To Open or Not to Open?

Mathematically speaking, opening cases is a losing financial proposition. Valve programs the drop rates so that the vast majority of openings lead to consumer-grade (blue) weapon skins worth significantly less than the price of the key.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% chance
- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% possibility
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% opportunity
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% opportunity
- **Unique Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% chance

Note: Percentages are approximations based upon neighborhood tracking and information collection.

Best Practices for Unboxing

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like home entertainment (like going to a casino), not as a financial investment technique.
2. **Buy the Skin Directly:** If a gamer particularly desires a Neon Rider or an AWP Asiimov, it is generally more affordable to purchase the skin outright from the market rather than trying to unpack it.
3. **Treat Cases as Investments:** Many players prefer to purchase discontinued cases, hold them in their inventory, and sell them later as their rarity drives the price up.
