Tools and prep that set you up for refreshing numbers

You can degree with a metal tape and a pencil, however a few improvements aid. A stable 25 foot tape with a durable blade makes long runs more easy. An L square, a small degree, and a straightedge catch out of sq. corners and bows. Blue painter's tape enables you to mark cupboard faces with no injury. A laser distance meter speeds matters up in tight kitchens, yet double investigate long runs with a tape. For diagrams, use graph paper or a digital drawing app which can lock to scale. Confirm overhangs, thickness, and done heights

Overhang judgements drive the two aesthetics and function. Standard overhang on the the front fringe of kitchen countertops degrees from 1 to one.5 inches beyond the cabinet face. If you may have inset doors, measure from the body, no longer the doors. On uncovered end panels and at dishwasher panels, verify you'll have the equal overhang, not a random deeper lip. Material thickness interacts with entire height.
