Step 2: Update Graphics Drivers

- **AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition and look for optional or recommended chauffeur updates.

Step 3: Adjust In-Game Settings and Launch Options

- Lower particle detail and international shadow quality if experiencing engine overloads.
- Eliminate old CS: GO launch choices that are obsolete in CS2 (such as -tickrate 128 or tradition directX flags).

Step 4: Manage Background Applications

- Discord In-Game Overlay
- Xbox Game Bar
- Overwolf and third-party stat trackers
- MSI Afterburner and RTSS
