- **Glow-in-the-Dark (GITD) Items:** While radiant weapon sights or armor pieces can provide away a gamer's position in the dark, **glowing sheet metal doors and storage boxes** are tactical necessities for finding loot in a pitch-black base.

Visual Skins

For gamers who choose design over stealth, *Rust* deals an incredible array of styles:

- **Cyberpunk and Sci-Fi:** Neon accents, holographic screens, and metallic plating.
- **Post-Apocalyptic Grunge:** Rust, spikes, blood, and scavenged metal scraps that fit the lore of the video game.
- **Humorous and Meme Skins:** Animal-themed onesies, funny masks, and intense pastel colors that humiliate challengers upon defeat.
